Greetings!

This year as you celebrate Independence Day, think about what it has cost to obtain and maintain the freedoms we enjoy. Get involved and be a part of maintaining those freedoms. And have a great time watching fireworks (but be "safe and sane" as the California slogan goes).

July includes the Imperial Senate meeting. The dates are July 18 and 19. The place is the John C. Fremont Branch, Los Angeles Public Library, 6121 Melrose Ave., Los Angeles, CA 90038. Telephone: (213) 962-3521. Senators have received the agenda. If you have not already spoken with your Senator (Royal Crown or Duke/Duchess Elector) about your concerns, please be certain to do so. Many of the Estates General of the subdivisions are meeting to debate and give direction to their Senators. Vivant! While voting is limited to Senators, anyone who wishes to observe the proceedings is welcome to attend. The meeting begins at 10:00 a.m. each day.

Kudos and many thanks go to Sir Dilvish for his masterful work on the Agenda. There is a lot there, and he has done a superb job of getting the Agenda ready for the Senate. Vivat Sir Dilvish!

We have good news on the 501(c)(3) front! All of the regions are in compliance with the needs for filing. Filing has been done, and we are now awaiting the government's reply to our application for a change in status. Sir Nikolai has labored long and hard in this area, giving of both himself and his resources. Vivat Sir Nikolai!

With the new status will come new responsibilities and accountability. As a social organization with a small budget, the U.S. government has had little interest in us. Now that donations to the Adrian Empire, Inc. will be tax deductible under the new status -- when it is approved -- the government will have a stronger interest in our affairs, particularly as the amount of money flowing through the organization should increase significantly. Our

accounting must be more thorough and follow standard practices. The Imperium is establishing new practices and preparing a manual to help Stewards in all of the regions understand their responsibilities under the 501(c)(3) status. A new Writ is being published elsewhere in this Herald to address one aspect of this. Our thanks to DeDe Chavez for her work and assistance.

Recently there have been some problems with timeliness in addressing such things as memberships, etc. At times the source lies within the region. At other times the problem has been at the Imperial level. For that We are truly sorry, but We believe the solution has been found. Sir Duriel van Hansard has labored greatly in the area of bringing the accounts and database up to date. All of the regions have received accounts of the Imperial records. If there is a discrepancy with local records, the Crowns or Stewards need to contact Sir Duriel as quickly as possible to reconcile the differences. Vivat Sir Duriel!

Following the Senate meeting, the end of summer will not be far behind, and that brings with it the Imperial War. Sir Eric the Aweful is working on securing a site for the war, and others have offered some suggestions. Some have asked why we do not have the war at the same site as last year. The reason is that the site is in Esperance, both the Empress and Emperor reside in Esperance, and the By-Laws forbid the War from being held in the subdivision in which the Imperial Crown or Crowns reside. If you like the idea of a permanent site, let your Senators and Grand Assemblors know, but it will take a By-Laws amendment to change the current practice. This year We will be experimenting with a "Shadow War" on the East Coast. Because of By-Laws requirements the Shadow War will not count, but if all goes well the Imperial Estates will no doubt be presented with a plan to hold the Imperial War at multiple sites as Adrian grows.

Now is not too early for those who wish to vie for the Imperial Throne to begin making themselves known. Some may be planning to do so at the Senate meeting. The requirements include having a successful reign as King or Queen OR having ruled as Duc/Duchess and being a second-level Knight. We wish the best to those who will follow Us upon the Throne.

The full Imperial Estates General will meet the first weekend in November. Items for the Agenda need to be submitted by August 1. This overlaps with the time period given for Grand

Assemblors to vote on referenda from the Senate meeting, but the By-Laws dictate the meeting times, and the lead time is necessary to have the agenda done.

Mundania keeps rearing its ugly head. I was hampered in my ability to keep up with matters due to a variety of personal and family matters. Her Imperial Majesty Dame Katherine has done an excellent job of tending to the needs of the Empire. Vivat Dame Katherine! Aurore of Byzantium was forced to resign as Chronieler due to mundane issues. During the interim the Cominolos have done a masterful job of getting the Herald out to everyone who is on their list. Vivant! (Since Sir Duriel has updated the lists, those of you who have been looking for a Herald should start receiving it.) Mundane pressures are also forcing Sir Dilvish to step back from his duties and involvement. We will miss your active voice in Our affairs.

There are, however, those who are willing to step forward and shoulder the responsibilities that remain. Dame Francesca will be assuming the office of Chronieler beginning immediately. 6. ARE YOU ENTERING AN ARTS ENTRY? More than one category? We can set you to judge a different one.

7. If we can set up the judging of the Food, Bardics & verbal doc. before combat starts, can you judge part of or all of them?

8. If you are or were an Arts and Science Minister, can you help? Help sign-ups, set-up, judging, take down.

Artisans::::

1. REMEMBER: after you sign-in, YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE for bringing your entry to the tables for before the list closes and picking up your entry and comment cards before CLOSING COURT.

2. KNOW what list your item is going on before you bring it to the table. Is it Fine, Crafted, Bardic or Food and Alchemy?

3. Have you documentation READY with your entry. If your documentation is oral, MAKE SURE someone has written that down and put it with your entry.

4. You can enter all four categories, BUT you can be only on one list Knights or Masters NOT BOTH. and you one get ONE War point.

5. IF your documentation is verbal YOU MUST BE AVAILABLE to the judges. They do not have time to hunt you down.

Those of you who have requested the New Artisans and Judges Manual and have not reviewed them, Please ask your Hospitaler. If you don't have a Hospitaler request one from the Imperial Hospitaler. I have not sent everyone who requested the new manual one because in a couple of weeks the Imperial Estates are meeting and this manual will be revised at that time.



Cherry Pudding

This pudding refers to the Feast of Saint John the Baptist. Saint John is the patron saint of monks. His name is invoked against spasms, convulsions, epilepsy, drought, and hail. His feast day is December 27th, so these cherries would have been a winter variety and not quite as sweet as spring cherries. With that in mind, you may want to cut down the sugar somewhat.



I am offering this in three forms so you can see the transition from medieval to modern. The original is presented in all its glory, as it was found in a 14th century manuscript(1). Then its translation into modern English so you can make heads or tails out of it. Finally, I've provided the redaction, which is a recipe that has been rewritten with modern measurements, instructions, etc. Part of the fun of medieval cooking is that a number of redactions are possible from a single recipe. It all depends on how you translate terms like "plenty" and "porcioun." This redaction is from the Medieval Kitchen(2).

Chireseye (original)

For to make chireseye tak chiryes at the fest of Seynt Iohn the Baptist & do away the stonys. Grynd hem in a mortar & after frot hem wel in a seue so that the ius be wel comyn out; & do than in a pot & do therein feyre gres or boter & bred of wastel ymyd & of sugar a god perty & a porcioun of syn. & wan it is wel ysodyn & ydressedy in dyschis, stik therin clowis of gilofre & strew theron suger.

Chireseye (translation)

To make chireseye, take cherries at the Feast of Saint John the Baptist and remove the pits. Grind them in a mortar, and then press them hard through a sieve to extract all their juice; and put this in a pot and put in a good fat or butter and good white bread, plenty of sugar, and some wine. And when it is this and served up on plates, stud it with cloves and sprinkle with sugar.

Cherry Pudding (redaction)

1-1/2 pounds ripe cherries
2 slices dry white bread
1/2 cup sugar
1-1/2 tablespoons butter
5 ounces good red wine
whole cloves (for garnish)

Stem and pit the cherries, puree them in a blender or food processor, then strain in a fine sieve, pressing hard to extract as much juice as possible.

Remove the crusts from the bread, and cut the bread into small pieces. In a heavy saucepan, combine the bread, cherry juice, wine, sugar and butter. Bring to a boil. Lower heat and simmer until the mixture thickens and the bread falls apart and swells (10 - 15 minutes). Turn into a serving bowl and chill well. Stud the top with cloves. Refrigerate until served.

Book Reviews

"Ah, the Middle Ages! When men were men and women were chattel!" How many times have you heard such sentiments expressed? For some of you, far too often. Nonetheless, we have a picture of the medieval period as a time when women were little more than adjuncts to their male-dominated families. While it is true that women enjoyed fewer legal rights than men (at least in most places and at most times), it is not true that they lived drab, uninteresting, uninvolved lives. Two books of interest to medieval readers illustrate this in two very different ways. *Uppity Women of Medieval Times* by Vicki Leon (Conart Press, 1997) presents a collection of delightful anecdotes about women from many different cultures and times who made their mark upon their society. The lives are well chosen, and the writing is witty and insouciant without becoming overly flippant. Consider the following two anecdotes. "Aethelfled: Motherhood was okay, she thought; it was labor that was the pits. After the birth of her first daughter, therefore, Aethelfled politely told her hubby Ethelred "not tonight, not ever, honey" and swore herself to chastity. Unlike other royal couples we could mention, this royal twosome of ninth-century Anglo-Saxon England still worked together. Aethelfled for one couldn't get enough of the battlefield; swords in hand, the two often went into battle. There was no shortage of battles to attend, either. At that time, the island was a real rat's nest of small quarreling kingdoms. Aethelfled's father, known to history as Alfred the Great, had spent most of his life fighting the Danes, who at that time thought of England as "the Viking destination we'd most like to pillage and burn." After her dad and husband died, Aethelfled kept up the pugnacity. She managed to pull the quarreling Mercians of central England into some semblance of unity and was called "Lady of the Mercians" in gratitude. At forty, this workaholic Saxon spent the next eight years building fortresses,

leading troops into Wales, helping her brother Edward out militarily, and negotiating alliances between the equally prickly Brits, Picts, and Scots against the Danish Vikings. For a breather, she captured the strategic cities of Derby and Leicester. Eventually, Aethelfled came to be looked upon as the unofficial ruler of both Danes and Mercians. Given how well the feminine touch had worked thus far, everyone sort of expected Aethelfled's daughter to be the next ruler. Sure enough, when Aethelfled finally caught the wrong end of a mace in a battle at Stratfordshire in 918, daughter Aelfwyn inherited the crown. About ten minutes later, however, her uncle Edward conveniently "forgot" about the years of military help his sister had given him, pushed aside female heir Aelfwyn, and made himself king of England."

"Barbara Baesinger Fugger: Fugger was a name to be reckoned with, even back in circa 1450 Germany. The daughter of a stuffy Augsburg banking family, Barbara Baesinger married into the Fuggers, who were big-time merchants in textiles and spices. Eleven children later, bright Barbara had to pick up the pieces when her hubby died young. Good at juggling career and home life, she educated the kids, expanded the business, and made money, all while personally training the elder sons in management. From the first, she'd pegged her younger son, Jacob, for priesthood. After sending him to Rome to study, Barbara had him turn in his collar when it became evident that sons Ulrich and George needed help in running the family business. Every bit his mother's son, Jacob was terrific at making money. He jump-started international banking and finance, cornered the copper market, made high-interest loans and low-interest investments for popes and kings alike. Fifteenth-century popes did a land-office business in the sale of benefices (revenue that came with a church position) and indulgences,

a "pay-as-you-go" way for Catholics to erase sins, venial and mortal. Jacob's biggest coup? Buying the election of Holy Roman Emperor for Charles V -- for which Jacob raised 554,000 guilders. (Jacob averaged 54 percent return on his investments; who knows how much his "investment" in Charles paid off.) Barb's son was no known as Jacob the Rich Fugger, and no snickers either. Eventually the trade in indulgences got so disgraceful that activists like Martin Luther brought about the Protestant reformation. And the woman who put it all in motion -- the Fugger fortune and the business empire that still exists today -- was Barbara."

The second book, *Pope Joan* by Donna Woolfolk Cross (Crown, 1996) is completely different in nature, style and scope. An historical novel based on the "legend" of a female pope, the book presents the plight of Joan, an intelligent and talented woman in a small village with no hope of a better life. Then she has the good fortune to befriend a traveling cleric, who arranges for her to attend the cathedral school. A Viking raid provides the opportunity for Joan to die and "John" to be born. As John, she becomes first a monk, later a doctor, and finally the pope. Her secret is revealed when she gives birth, prematurely, during a papal procession and dies. The author presents much evidence of the historicity of "Pope Joan" and raises the question of how many other women have contributed to Western civilization by disguising themselves as men, citing other well-known examples throughout history.

Both books are highly readable and should give new perspectives on the role of women in the Middle Ages. I recommend them to Adrians seeking something a little bit different from the usual medieval stories and histories.





