It is with a sad heart that I must report to you on the Imperial Wars of September. I am saddened because I miss the new friends and old that we were able to visit on the East Coast and the problems that we have had to deal with from the West Coast War.

The war on the East Coast went exceptionally well. His Majesty, Sir Killian of York made peace with his conscience and my good husband. His chivalry and strength will be challenged on the road he has chosen. There was a good time had by all that attended, and the war was held without incident. We have the greatest respect and hope for all the populace of the East Coast. With the strength of your leaders, your future will surely be bright. We would like to Thank everyone who assisted us and made the war run as smoothly as it did. Dame Shalain, you put on a wonderful war and served to Us wonderful meals and a great feast. To our herald, you are Wonder Fool, I mean Wonderful, and your assistance was a great help. To Baroness Kyra and Dame Brigid, you ran your respective lists beautifully. To everyone else, including but not limited to the children, Sapphire and the marshals, Our heart felt appreciation.

The war on the West coast, We hear was the largest that was ever held, and for this we should be very proud. The final numbers totaled over 400 attending, which is very impressive.

We hope that in the future we will be able to learn from the mistakes that were made at this war, to make the next one more enjoyable for everyone that attends. I understand that the Arts were run in an exceptional manner and this is because of the hard work of Dame Maebe and Dame Rahja. I also have been lead to believe that the combat was successful, in no small part to Sir Allyn and the Imperial Family. Our thanks to Sir Mathghahaim, Sir Francois, Sir Winfred and all the Crowns and other Marshals that helped keep the field as peaceful and safe as it was. We would like to Thank Dame Serina and the Stewards for their work, and everyone else who assisted. Last but certainly not least, We would like to thank Dame Katherine and Sir Jehan for their work as site Autocrats.

It is with a heavy heart that I must report some of the problems that have been reported to us, as a result of the War. The most horrendous problems was the theft. Someone broke into a car that held the Imperial funds collected at the war, and stole from the Empire \$2596.00 in cash. We will be making a detailed report to the estates in November regarding the theft, and the effects it will have on the Empire. As of right now, Our hopes to redistribute the funds due the local subdivisions must be postponed until the following reign. This theft breaks Our heart, as much of the hard work and sacrifice that Ourselves and Our ministers have made in the past year to make the Imperial Government solvent are now for naught.

We look to the future with excitement. We will be attending the Grand Tournament in Aragon this month and will look forward to seeing many old friends at the Tournament and at the Coronation. As Our days draw to an end, We have only thanks and good will to you Our Populace.

Continue on Military through the historic arsenal gates and branch left onto Adams St. Turn left on Park Road, winding around till after you pass under the freeway and turn right on Camel Rd (landmark: brick warehouses on the right just before). Continue down to the Camel Barn's lower parking lot. We'll be in the big historic stone building on the right, first floor entrance.

Tierra del Fuego

Unto the populace of Adria we send greetings!

This is our busiest time of year, with many of our members giving body & soul to the staging of the Northern Renaissance Pleasure Faire. This is the "original faire", begun in 1966 by Phyllis Patterson in Marin County. Attendance ranges from 10,000 to 17,000 visitors daily during the eight week run. The new site combined with a longer visitors day (10am to 7pm Sat & Sun "onstage") and an 8 week run makes this a trying year for all of us. Some members could not make the transition and so the burden rests more heavily on fewer shoulders. It is well carried though, and morale remains good.

Our members have commanded and administrated the northern faire St. Michael's Guild for over 20 years under the auspices of the Queen's Guard Association and the Renaissance Military Society. They comprise Worthington's Company of Foote, an English infantry unit (1968?), the Schwarz Fahnenlein, a company of landsknechts (since 1980); a new contingent of English Border Horse; and the families and baggage train associated with the armies. We provide exhibitions of 16th c. period drill & combat; the Queen's Guard on Progress; portray camp and village life of the time; and display arts, skills and pastimes for the visitors. The current Faire run began August 28th, and runs through October 17th. Members participate in three mandatory workshop weekends beforehand (wherein we build our camp, attend classes, and practice military & civilian skills) and one tear-down weekend following the Faire. Participants will spend 12 consecutive weekends on site from 8am Saturday morning to 8pm Sunday evening encamped. All-in-all it is a trying but very rewarding effort that gives us a chance to share our passion with over 200,000 visitors every year.

We are readying for the Guild's Feast of St. Michael at the Faire, September 25th, which traditionally brings our members together for a day of feasting on roast suckling pig and a variety of English and German dishes made by the members. Today, as I write this, some of our members will meet for an archery

tournament, feast, and Tarocchi game in a cooler coastal location while the others toil in the Queen's employ. October will see some of our members off to the Ren Faire and First International Steel Tourney in Aragon, looking forward to meeting (and playing) with others of like mind.

In closing court, the Crowns of Umbria bestowed titles. His Imperial Highness, Sir Nikolai, was granted the title Lord Baronet. Her Excellency, Marquessa Justina, was granted the title of Lady. Also, during closing court, Sir Waylan Winchester's baseborn brother laid claim to the lands of Winchester, bringing forth the Sword of Winchester to legitimize his claim. 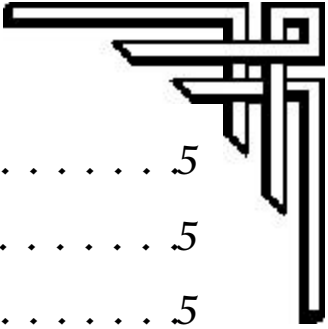
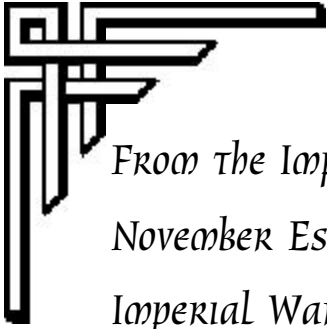

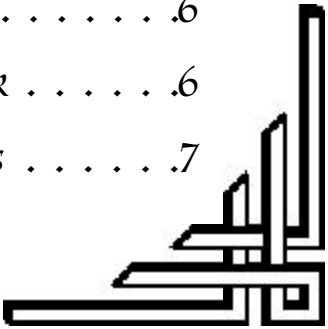
