Greetings to the New Year

We would like to welcome the new rulers to their thrones, as the lines of succession have been very busy as of late. We do congratulate Vilhelm von Seiken Uladrachen, now King of Esperance, and Maedb Hawkins Drakonja, now Queen of Esperance. On our eastern shores in York we do extend tidings and hopes for a good year ahead to King Raffe and Queen Brejenne. And in the mountainous deserts of Umbria we do send felicitations to King Rashalak and Queen Delia, and wish them well.

As we venture into the New Year which is come upon us, there are many tasks being undertaken that while eliciting little fanfare or giving much show still take much time. Work is ongoing on integrating the past two years of revisions of our bylaws into the main body of the document. We hope to publish them soon. In addition there are issues of policy that We will be contacting both Crowns and Ministers to work with us on. Of primary importance to us at this time are (not necessarily in this order) the publication of the fully revised bylaws, reviewing the revised bylaws for inconsistencies, the updating and refinement of the website and Adrian documents therein, working with several newly forming areas, refining the budget, reviewing the subdivisions' reporting, and getting around to visit the rest of the Empire as much as possible after the first of the year.

On Shires & Such

While we consider growth to be good and greatly affirm our desire to see the Empire flourish, it would be unwise for us to go unknowingly into the future without fully examining our resources and understanding how we grow. We wish to share the information and recent discussion with our populace at large, that we might all have a better understanding of the process. And then we wish to make preliminary announcements regarding the formation of new subdivisions currently in the offing.

It recently came into focus for the Estates when reviewing the Empire's budget, both past and proposed, that we have costs

which are directly influenced by the number of subdivisions we have regardless of their size or level of activity. The major impact is the cost of insurance. The insurers must assume that each subdivision is holding as many events as the bylaws indicate they should have, which would be one per month. One can draw several conclusions from this information. The reality is that the larger subdivisions subsidize the smaller ones based on the inability to generate revenues proportional to their costs. This is known and accepted as an appropriate form of nurturing support. The time expended by Imperial Ministries to help smaller newer subdivisions to grow and learn is also an expected and beneficial activity. The importance of this recognition goes in both directions. There is great burden in a small group to diligently hold events and establish and maintain timely reporting procedures. Fewer members, fewer volunteers to draw on. Additionally the time needed to administrate a Shire can conflict with the time needed to recruit new members and develop momentum as well. Those who wish to form Shires in general will do well to illustrate activity by operating as Cantons prior to forming for a time. In this fashion they may confidently enter into the Estates with reputation established.

We are then happy to announce the impending formation of two new Shires, one within our continent and the other far from our shores. A group to be styled as Avernus is currently forming as a Canton, led by Greyland Winter, with the expectation of becoming a Shire. We have tasked a member whose been called far away to Sicily, Ivan the Forsaken, with undertaking laying the ground work for formation of the Shire of St. George there. Activities will necessarily be limited to the military base there, as it is legally American soil. To expand beyond its confines would involve international legal issues that the Empire is not organizationally prepared to address at this time. And, heard on the wind we do have another request from elsewhere in this continent that has been previously "undiscovered" lands for us. Hopefully there will be more news from them soon.

What is Adria?


Both the crown war and the coronation were wonderful events and, according to reports, fun was had by all. The ghost of the late king and his grieving queen did much of the work for the coronation feast and their efforts are deeply appreciated, as are the efforts of all of those who cooked, served, and cleaned up after the event.

His new majesty deemed it proper to step down from the position of Marquis de Aggravain and the position was given to Sir Jamie the Red and Al Farissa Rahja Ahmina bint Hussam of Basir as Marquis and Marquessa respectively. A general shuffling of households and other estates followed and a new county has been named, the County of Aguilar with the Count Patrick [I'll send you his last name tomorrow!] at its head. The barony of Bloodstone has a new baroness, Baroness Angelique Sophie. The houses within the barony of Bloodstone are the House Bloodstone, the House Veekbok, and the House Nunya.

Future events include a 12th Night Celebration within the Canton of Aquitaine on January 8th. Unfortunately, it will probably be over before most of you have a chance to read this copy of the Herald. It promises to be another delightful event. It will follow the normal kingdom event which will be held in the city of Orange at Eisenhower Park. 12th Night will be held within Aquitaine so some driving from one to the other will be required. The two events on the eighth comprise the normal kingdom event and the Canton of Aquitaine event. The normal event by the

Canton of Tara is expected to be held the following Saturday.

February events include the normal Canton of Aquitaine event on the first Saturday of the month (the 5th), the kingdom event on the second Saturday (the 12th), and the normal Canton of Tara event on the third Saturday of the month (the 19th).



Arts Judging in Esperance

I (the Queen) have had the pleasure of serving the Empire first as Esperance's Deputy Minister, then as Royal Minister, and finally as Imperial Deputy Minister of Arts and Sciences. In those capacities, I was obliged to enforce the rules. Although I could certainly suggest changes, there were many other priorities for those in charge, and not much happened. I have experienced, firsthand, the trials and tribulations of the system. I am committed to making some of those changes happen. The Imperial Minister of Arts and Sciences, Sir Duriel van Hansard, has also promised many changes to improve the way the Arts are run. We (the Crown) are looking forward to working with him on this monumental task, but are unwilling to move at the same speed as Imperial changes usually move.

We are making our first change in the hopes that participation will increase, and the artisans' scores will be more accurately reflect the projects presented. In the past, it has been the custom and tradition to start the scoring at the maximum 10 in each of the 3 categories (craftsmanship, functionality and authenticity/documentation). From there, the judges marked down, providing an explanation with every mark-down.

Beginning at the January Crown event, the judges will begin their scoring at the median number of 5. From there, they will score both up and down (with explanations). This will allow the judges to continue recognizing deficits or errors. An entry that shows minimal effort, but meets all the minimum requirements, will receive a minimal score (presumably 15). This will be enough to allow them to receive a participation point, but not enough to win the tourney (hopefully). Judges have been clamoring for a way to recognize effort and excellence above and beyond the minimum requirements. By giving them the ability to judge upward, We hope this will allow them to do that. The better a project is, in any facet of the judging, the better the score will be.

Our Royal Minister of Arts and Sciences is also very experienced, and will be more than

happy to work with anyone who wishes help. Sir Ce'Wulf is a gem, and We are lucky to have him in the position.

York

York sends greetings to the esteemed populace of Adria

It has been long since you've received correspondence from us but events have been moving swiftly in York. There were 118 arts projects entered, 60 combatants for shinai and rapier and over 22 suits of steel on the field. It was a long, hard fought war with the ultimate victors being Sir Raffé and Dame Brejenne Cunningham.

The December Court of King Killian Oakesblood and Queen Jericho Gutte d'Or was called to order on the morning of December 12. Business brought before the Crowns began with Dame Brejenne Cunningham of House Thistledown, the Queen's heir calling forth Illora Llywelyn of Caer Morrigu. Dame Brejenne presented Illora with a bottle of fairy dust received directly from the Queen of Fairies herself in appreciation for the fine job she did helping out with the Arts and Sciences tournaments during the last month's crown war. Sire Zabrina DeVine and Giacomo de Verona Lieutenant of the Musketeers presented some lovely gems and jewels to Sir Captain Thorne and his lovely wife Dona Laura, both couples belong to House Giovanni.

Sir Trakx Greenwood of House Coventry presented a birthday gift of a shinai to his Page Magnus the II Meladius of Coer Valiant. Page Magnus seemed quite pleased with his gift and Sir Trakx was seen later that day giving his Page his first lesson. From the looks of it this young man will be knighted before he shaves.

Our first Archery collegium was announced, to be held on December the 19th at Sir Trakx's personal estate. It is hoped that this will be a great success and we will have some archery knights in our ranks by the summer of 2001.

The Arts tournament was won by Sire Zabrina DeVine of Giovanni for her pomander. The steel tournament was won by Baldessar Mondì

of Giovanni which gives him the win he needed to achieve his knighthood. Huzzah, Baldessar!!! The knights list ren was won once again by Sir Captain Tristan Thorne of Giovanni. The Shinai and Sergents list ren were both taken by Squire Iorwerth Llywelyn of Caer Morrigu. Iorwerth is the squire of Sir Trakx Greenwood.

On a more personal note Squire Griffin and Squire Oriana of House Coventry have a new addition to their household. Squire Oriana gave birth on December 3 to Charles Michael who weighed in at 7 pounds 12 ounces. Griffin and Oriana are both squires to Sir Trakx Greenwood. There have been rumors of a future betrothal between the offspring of Squire's Griffin and Oriana and Sir Trakx and Moira Greenwood's lovely daughter Tara who blessed them with her birth on the 16th of September. These rumors are being discounted by both sets of parents due to the youth of the parties involved, but this may be something to watch for in the future.

Closing court held a moment of sadness when King Killian reminded his populace that it would be his and Queen Jericho's last time upon the throne as the coronation of Dame Brejenne and Sir Raffé Cunningham would be held on the following Saturday. There was a moment of reflecting upon the past but we all look forward to the future, "The King is Dead, long live the King" and Queen of course.

December 18th the day of the coronation of the new King and Queen dawned bright and clear despite the rainy weather that had been predicted to continue in our area, obviously a good omen for the future. The Lodge to be used in the ceremony was swarming with people early in the morning as it was prepared for the grand feast to be held later that evening. The weather continued to hold and the populace of York began to arrive as dusk began to fall. Nearly the entire populace turned out to participate in what was the grandest feast ever to be held in the Kingdom of York.

The Lodge was lit entirely by candlelight and soft medieval music played in the background as our populace greeted one another with hugs and kisses all around. White linen graced the tables, while pine boughs, cones and holly provided centerpiece decoration in honor of the Yule season. Banners representing each Estate in York were flown from the ceiling. The many candelabras were crafted by the very talented master forger Lord Killian Oakesblood. King Killian and Queen Jericho were escorted into the hall by a Scot's piper and drummer, they proceeded through an archway of swords held by the Queen's guard. After a brief

statement and some tears of good bye, their regalia was received by the Chancellor and Bishop of York, Sir Trakx Greenwood.

After a moment of silence, the wail of the bagpipes were heard again and to the beat of the drummer the Heirs entered the hall. The very regal couple, Sir Raffé and Dame Brejenne Cunningham came forward followed by Pages Illora Llywelyn and Thorin Meladius who carried the chains of estate and crowns. They were attended by Squire Sky O'Malley Meladius, Dame Brejenne's squire and Collin McKinnen. They both wore cream damask, Sir Raffé's tunic was trimmed in royal blue velvet and Dame Brejenne's gown was heavily worked with pearls and embroidered with gold bees, this was topped by a royal blue velvet overdress.

The Bishop of York administered the oaths and the crowns of State were blessed by the Archdruid of York, Sir Lord Nikademis Fiend, the crowns were then placed upon their heads. The crowns were spectacular, interwoven thistles with insets of amethysts and malachite.

After the ceremony, they joined Lord Killian and Dame Jericho at the high table and sat upon their thrones for the first time as King and Queen. Many people came forward to offer their best wishes and present them with gifts. As they held Court, Sir Trakx Greenwood came forward on behalf of his good friend His Imperial Highness Prince Nikolai and asked permission to fulfill a request that had been entrusted to him by the eminent Prince. His request was granted and Sir Trakx called upon Dame Jericho Gutte d'Or to present herself before the Thrones.

Dame Jericho had been nominated and confirmed as "Protector of the Dream" by the Imperial Estates. 

Medieval Navigation, Part 1 - Astrolabe

This is a first in a series of nautically minded articles gleaned in part from my own research and that of others within the SCA Nautical Guild, known as the Loyal Guild of Saint Erasmus (d. 303? Italian prelate and martyr, he is also known as Saint Elmo, the patron Saint of sailors). As the Adrian Ambassador to this Guild, it is my hope and duty to bring knowledge of things nautical (especially the Arts and Sciences) to the Adrian Empire.

The astrolabe was an early form of navigational device used by both sailors and land based explorers. It was developed in the 10th Century by Arabs and was adopted for use by many different cultures, mainly the Spanish and Portuguese. The astrolabe was in use up to the 17th Century, before being replaced by various quadrants, Hadley's octant, and finally the sextant.

The basic use of the astrolabe was to measure the height of astronomical bodies (the sun, moon, and stars) from the horizon, and thereby determine the observer's latitude (position north or south of the equator). In this aspect, the astrolabe was only a smaller version of the fore staff - an early sighting instrument developed by the Egyptians. However, the astrolabe was a much more complete measuring instrument. It also enabled the observer to determine the approximate time of day, as well as the phase of the moon, both useful for determining the next high or low tide.

The one major piece of information the astrolabe (or any other of the Medieval contemporary navigational instruments) couldn't give was the longitude (distance east or west of the home port). In further articles, I'll discuss some of the other navigational instruments and the search for longitude.

Knitting with Steel

ITEMS NEEDED TO MAKE CHAIN MAIL

ARMOR

To start with, you will need a 3-foot long rod the diameter you plan to make the rings. If you can, have a hole drilled about 1 to 1 ½ inches from the top of the rod. You will need a pair of vice grips to do the wrapping of the metal with, 2 pair of needle nose pliers (Craftsman brand would be best in case they break), a pair of 12 gauge metal cutters, 1 pair of gloves, and a lot of patience to do the rapping.

Then you need to locate the material to be wrapped, either a welding shop or a hardware store for the 14 gauge galvanize steel. If they don't have the material, just ask them to order the wire for you and that you will be buying the metal over a length of time, (usually they have to buy at least 8 rolls to get the material that you need, so be ready to buy a lot of wire) and make sure that you ask for the 10 lb. rolls, not the 100 yards worth of wire.




