IMPERIAL ESTATES MEET IN CAERLEON NEW COMBAT AND ARTS MANUALS GO INTO EFFECT

Twenty-five members of the Imperial Government and Estates met in the Archduchy of Caerleon the weekend of July 19 and 20 to take action on a number of issues concerning the Empire. The Duke and Duchess of Caerleon acted as host and hostess, and the Imperial Estates were treated to displays of the artistic talents of the populace.

New Manuals

Two major pieces of legislation enacted were the adoption of the new combat manual and the revocation of the old arts manual, allowing the new arts manual to take its place. The issue of the minimum age for steel combat was referred to the Board of Directors for a decision and inclusion. Both manuals will go into effect August 19, 2002, and be in effect for this year's Imperial Wars. Additional information on the new manuals and how they will be implemented for the Imperial Wars will be published in this issue.

Actions Taken

Some thoughts from a few who knew her:



People of Adria,

Greetings and salutation. It is my privilege to pen this missive to you my fellow citizens of the Empire so that you might better know your candidates in order to allow you the opportunity for an informed decision when the time to raise arms to support a contender for Imperial War.

First, you should know who I am. I am His Grace Sir Johan "Kreigenschleigel" (or Warhammer) von Hohenstaufen. I have played in Adria for 11 years. I am a first level combat knight and a first level ministry knight. A few projects I wish to work on is the distribution of hard copies of Imperial Manuals to the Subdivisions. Why? So that you can see what we are doing. Be sure that we your government is doing its job. Why hard copies? Well granted the present Imperial Crowns and I believe a few before them started to put them on the Internet. But sometimes either the net doesn't work or something. I think that a local Crown having hard copies insures that answers are always available to inquiring minds in a local sub division. I know how evil lady luck can be to me when I need answers and the very minute I need those answers my computer starts acting up or a comet passes over the Earth and interrupts service for the very week when I need it not to. I believe that this is the continuation of a good idea started by the Imperial Crowns that went before me.

Another project I would like to start is the publishing of Judicial Precedence from the local subdivisions. This way one can see how the different subdivisions ruled in civil or less pleasant court cases through out the Empire. I think it would be of great value for anyone who needs some judicial answers.

That is how change occurs. The above system is made so that you the people might make changes in the game you play. It does not matter what field you wish to look into. **SIR KARL VON KATZBURG,
EMPEROR OF ADRIA

Good People of Adria, Greetings!

Sir Karl von Katzberg and Dame Elisabeth Grey do hereby announce our candidacy for the Imperial Crowns of the Empire of Adria, both being members in good standing and eligible by dint of our station. If elevated to the Throne it is our intent to rule as co-rulers; Dame Elisabeth will act as President and Sir Karl will act as Vice President.

I, Sir Karl, have served the people of Adria the past 9 months as Emperor of Adria, and before that served 18 months as Archduke of Terre del Fuego, being voted Viscount upon retirement. I have extensive experience with the workings of the Imperial government having served as Imperial Justicar (Nov. 98 to June 99), Imperial Chancellor (June 99 to Jan. 01), and as Justicar and Vice Chancellor (Jan. 01 to Nov. 01). I have attended all Imperial Estates meetings since July 97 with the exception of one, and have prepared all of the Imperial Estates Agendas from July 1998 through November 2001, as well as chairing 4 Imperial Estates meetings. I humbly submit that I am learned in the Law and have written many rulings that

have stood the test of time and have been incorporated into the Law. I have had the great honor to have been the first Knight in the Empire to attain knighthood in all 4 disciplines: Ministry (K-3), Combat (K-3), Arts (K-1), and Archery (K-2).

I, Dame Elisabeth, have served the people of Adria two years previously as Empress, and served 12 months as Archduchess of Terre del Fuego, being voted Viscountess upon retirement. I have attended every Imperial Estates Meeting since November 1998 with the exception of one. During my previous reign I oversaw the development of the new Arts Manual; brought Adria current with the Arizona Corporation Commission, completing four years of filings for 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000; oversaw reduction of backlog in the Empire's financial reporting; introduced electronic subscriptions; began the implementation of webbing the Adrian Herald and its archives; promoted development of several new shires – some now grown to Archduchies; and took the Empire to the East Coast for the first Imperial Estates Meeting. I will continue to promote furthering the development of east and west coast regional deputy ministers to attend to/and be responsible for Imperial Crown events, collegiums, and reporting (see below). I offer my committed service and experience with production of Imperial Crown events, the Empire's finances, and dedication to furthering the increased access to information and services for all members throughout the Empire. I hope to work to increase available materials for guidance in event planning, fundraising, development of a Crown's manual, and improve availability of information and guidance for new subdivisions. Additionally I would like to see the development of a tradition of Knight's Councils, gathered for commemoration, learning and sharing experiences; not just for courts of justice. That we all too often seem to gather only in sad times, for negative reasons, is unfortunate. As a member of the Chivalry, I hold a Knight Robe (K-1) and Knight Civil (K-2).

Some Ideas & Thoughts to Share

Adria's continuing to grow, and faces the challenge of keeping up with that growth. The Empire is vast; the last Imperial Estates meeting saw some 60 votes seated. We need to work hard to respond to the expanding need for information and provide the learning opportunities required to train people to

produce events and execute the responsibilities of their offices well. All this so that we responsibly put on good events that meet the needs of the populace – which ultimately is to have a place & time to gather and share friendships, learning, and experiences. Imperial Ministry structure & function in general needs to continue to develop stronger east and west coast deputies able to serve their locales and function as Imperial Crown event coordinators, leaving the Imperial Ministers to focus on coordination, leadership, management, providing more training opportunities for the populace, and aiding the Imperium's newer subdivisions (which are Imperial lands). During the last three years the Imperial Stewards Office has made vast strides in timely reporting, management, and access to individual members per their status. Problems that need to be addressed now generally are limited to working with subdivisions to help them self-audit their own finances. A means of addressing a subdivision's needs pertaining to auditing and solving their own accounting problems is required, providing the intense short term help they need without interfering in the Imperial Steward's timely performance. Primarily this may initially mean simply developing a standard information FAQ; in some cases it may mean specially appointing someone to work with them. The Imperial Rolls office needs an updated rolls manual, with a glossary of terms so that everyone is speaking the same language. An appendix added with formwork and FAQ's would be another vast improvement. We hope to have the Imperial Physicker's Office develop a nation wide database of registered EMT's and Adrian Physickers that event planners and the Imperial Deputy Ministers can draw on for pre-arranging their services. The Imperial Arts, having launched the new manual, faces the challenge of providing access to training for artisans throughout the Empire, to assure evenhanded implementation and opportunities for judges and participants alike. The newly developed marshalling manual, being adopted for "play test", faces the same challenge. Continuing the development of the University founded by the current Crowns, through the College of the Arts of War and the College of the Arts of Peace, will be a priority to aid these ministries.

In 1999, when Dame Elisabeth first ran for Imperial Crown, she published the following statement. We include it herein because it addresses a philosophy we share.

"Adria has experienced its share of triumphs, trials and tribulations. We must face forward to the future. That does not mean forget the past, disallow it, nor disinherit our beginnings. The challenge is to learn & move forward, distilling the best to take with us while setting aside some of the burdens we carry from it. This takes courage and focus. It means asking questions. Other organizations have taken varied paths, from the extreme of being ignorant of the very topics they purport to study while they play, to the extreme of being so academically closed that they benefit only themselves. It is very easy to stray down one of those paths. There is no one great moment when the path is turned. It is subtler than that. Each time the esoteric sneers at the newcomer, the athlete jeers at the academic, and the competitive snipe at each other we move one step in the wrong direction. Each time we help the less knowledgeable, respect each other's achievements, share our learning, and gather to celebrate our interests & friendships we become stronger and the path is easier to find. We educate ourselves; we educate others. We form friendships & an extended family that transcends boundaries,

both geographic and economic. That is because we form a bond based on common interest, and dare we say, passion. Passion to learn, share, strive and compete; and passion to play. It is perhaps the most democratic form of relationships one can create. An organization dedicated to sharing knowledge that extends the hand of the experienced to help the inexperienced; provides an opportunity to compete and earn (vs. be "given") self esteem; and all the while is dedicated to good sportsmanship, courtesy, and the reward of mirth that should follow can never be a bad thing. Let us work hard to nurture this. As we move forward & grow let us not fall in the trap of presuming one purpose at the expense of the other. Let us assure that in the future we can look back with the certain knowledge that we have not sacrificed learning for fun, fun for learning, nor the game for politics."

- Ø **Campground** – there are eighty-six sites for RV and tent camping, eight with full hookups and 78 with water and electricity. (Sixty sites are 50 amp and 20 sites are 30 amp) The campground office is open from 8am until 6pm on Saturdays and Sundays.

Campsite Information

Physical campsite location and information:

The Adrian Empire will have the entire eastern portion of the park. Sections shall include campsites #94-#146. Campsites #103-#105 are excluded (these are reserved for park maintenance). Campsites #128 and #129 are reserved for handicap only.

The Imperial campsite shall be centrally located on the site.

Amenities:

Hot showers, flush privies, fire pits (firewood and ice are available on-site and from nearby shopping centers.) and children's play-ground on site.

Park rules in brief: (A complete list of park rules may be acquired at the park's main office)

- This site is discreetly wet. The park expects any alcohol consumption to be within our own encampment and not blatantly obvious.
- Drugs are prohibited.
- This is a family campground. No pets are allowed.
- Persons under the age of 18 must be supervised by a parent or legal guardian.
- All wildlife and vegetation in the park is protected. Do not remove or destroy fallen branches, trees, flowers, or any vegetation or wildlife. Doing so will result in a fine.

- No parking on lawn area or sprinklers. Park only in designated parking areas.
- No parking in handicap areas without appropriate placard or sticker. Violators will be fined.
- The hours of 9:00 p.m.—8:00 a.m. are absolute quiet hours in the park. Your observance is appreciated. No loud TV's, radios, musical instruments or sound equipment.
- Do not tie lines to trees for any reason.
- All garbage and waste materials must be packaged and removed, by you, daily, to the trash dumpster.
- You and all members of your party enter all areas of the park at your own risk. Canyon RV park is not responsible or liable for your actions and those of your guests, nor for any property damage of any kind.

All classes are approximately 1 hour in length, and will take place in the Imperial Encampment. Combat Arrow Construction (Saturday 12:00 p.m.)

Instructor: Sir Connor O'Riordain

This class will teach how to build the arrows used during our combat.

Adrian Empire Rolls, Lists and Points: Policies and Practices (Saturday 3:00 p.m.)

Instructor: Dame Marcella Visconti

An overview, including handouts, of the Adrian Empire points earning system. Topics covered include the use of the Merits to Knighthood for audits for all four Knighthoods. How to properly record points including methods of archiving points and auditing for Knighthood including forms currently in use by the Imperial Rolls office. We will discuss Imperial practices concerning War points, Demo points and multiple wins and how and where the Imperial By-Laws address the merit based system of accruing points.

Early Period Middle Eastern Costume (Saturday 4:00 p.m.)

Instructor: Dame Elisabeth Grey

The elegant men's and women's costume in the Middle East has been defined by tradition for centuries. It has been influenced by the Ottoman Empire's domination for six centuries, from 1299 to 1923, and earlier by the Romans. Tunisian costume reflects the Greco-Roman influence of earlier centuries and today is essentially the same as it has been since Roman times to this day. The Gawahzee costumes so popular with modern day troupe dancers reflect 19th century street dancers costume, which are based from the Ottoman Empire's basic women's costume. While neckline shapes, sleeve embellishments, and material choices have varied over time the basic components are the same. This class will focus on woman's costume of our period, with an emphasis on materials and construction of the time and suggestions for suitable substitutes. Dame Elisabeth Grey dances with Sharifa's Troupe Tangiers, featuring Moroccan, Tunisian, Persian and Egyptian ethnic dancing; and founder of Nawariyaht, a small group of dancers who perform at living history events featuring pan-tribal style and ethnic dances.

The New Adria Combat Manual (Saturday 6:00 p.m.)

Instructor: Sir Arion Hirsch

Presentation and discussion of the New Adria Combat Manual and how it differs from the 2000 Adria Combat Manual. **Bring:** Comments for discussion listing the Section and Para-

I will also describe cartridge, organ pipe, box and knife pleating and where they might be used. **Bring:** Scissors, needles, thread, heavy fabric, a ruler and pencil.

The Astrolabe (Sunday 12:00 p.m.)

Instructor: Sir Michael Sinestro

This class will cover the history, the design, and the use of the planispheric astrolabe and the mariner's astrolabe.

Spinning with a Drop Spindle (Sunday, 3:00 p.m.)

Instructor: Ghislaine D'Auxerre

Before the spinning wheel, people (mostly women) spun wool and flax with a drop spindle. Learn how to spin your own yarn in this fun and informative class. All equipment and fibers will be provided.

Period Foods, Spices & Cooking For A Feast (Sunday, 4:00 p.m.)

Instructor: Dame Elisabeth Grey

20 years of period cooking experience summed up in one hour! Both parts of this class will include annotated reading/documentation source list, along with a web source listing. Please bring any reading or web sources you'd like to share!

Pt 1: Foods & Spices in Our World & Our Period: what meats, grains, fruits, vegetables & spices were a part of our world? What types of cooking did they do? Is stew period – or is it just something different then we're used to? And where do we find these answers, much less other people interested in sharing information and experiences. This course is intended to pass on the summary of many years of research, being aimed at both newcomer and experienced cooks alike.

Pt 2: Cooking a Period Feast (for a crowd): This class is intended to provide you with a mix-and-match list of reliable period recipes for a feast, along with useful information regarding how feasts were served and ways to handle preparation and storage. Many of the methods used to cook in the period allow for advance preparation, which is very useful for large feasts – especially if you have too few cooks. And, of course, there's always the "how can I do a period feast with little or no cooking".

IMPERIAL WAR

CROWN WRIT 02-02: ARTS AT IMPERIAL WAR

At the recent Imperial Estates Meeting, the Arts and Sciences Manual (1997, last updated in 1999) was revoked. This leaves the Arts and Sciences Manual of 2002 as the rules by which we enter and judge the arts in the Adrian Empire. There may be some questions as to how this will affect the Imperial War. We hope that this explanation will help everyone to understand.

The Manual of 2002 will be in use for the Imperial War. The Judging Guidelines of 2002, which are geared toward the Manual of 2002, will be used for Imperial War.

The Bylaws (Article XVI.B. War) say that eight war points will be awarded in the arts, four from each of the Masters' (now Journeymans') and Knights' lists. This doesn't change.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF ENTRIES - An artisan could enter each list for which they were qualified, which meant a total maximum of four entries per artisan. That maximum number of four will not change for this war.

CATEGORIES - are eliminated. If an artisan wishes to enter four of the same type of entry, or four different types, they may, as long as each has at least one major point of difference.

RESEARCH AND HOW-TO PAPERS - are allowed in the new manual, but there is no time to implement that change for the war, so they will not be accepted. (For future wars, they will most likely be handled the same way as off-site archery, requiring submission prior to the war.)

DIFFICULTY MATRICES - will be used for the war, as guidelines in determining that 10-point (maximum) portion of the total score.

WRITTEN DOCUMENTATION - is required, even if it is just an outline of what the oral documentation covers.

JUDGES - a panel of four judges per entry is preferred, and there are strict limitations on who may judge, and how much they are able to judge. (For instance, if you are entering the arts, you may judge no more than 30% of the other entries, and if you are a sworn vassal to a contender, you may not judge at all.)

WAR SCENARIOS - The scenarios described in the 2002 Manual will be used for this War. The four points will be awarded thusly on each of the two lists:

- **HIGHEST TOTAL** (The army with the highest total points on each of the lists. This is the same system that has been in place, minus the categories.)
- **HIGHEST AVERAGE** (The army with the highest average points on each of the lists. All scores will be tallied for these points. This is NOT be a percentage of the whole, but determined for each army (total points per army/number of entries per army).)
- **MOST TOTAL WINS** (The army with the most total wins awarded on each of the lists.)
- **MOST TOTAL MASTERWORKS/MASTERPIECES** (The army with the most total masterworks or masterpieces awarded on each of the lists.)

IMPERIAL CROWN WRIT 02-03: CONDUCT OF ARCHERY AT IMPERIAL CROWN WAR

From the Bylaws:

ARTICLE XVIII: CONDUCT OF TARGET ARCHERY IN TOURNAMENTS AND WAR

Realizing that facilities for archery are somewhat limited in some subdivisions the following will apply:

A. SCHEDULING

Archery need not be held on the same day or place as other tournament and war activities, and may be scheduled as completely separate activity. Archery activities that cannot be held due to lack of facilities, or acts of God (i.e. weather) may be rescheduled and or made up. This applies but is not limited to Crown tournaments, Events, and Wars, and Imperial tournaments, Events, and Wars.

B. WARS

Should it become necessary to hold War Target Archery lists offsite, or on a different day from the rest of the war, the Crown presiding over the War shall lay out in Writ the time, place, and conditions of the Target Archery, with the course being set by the Minister of Joust and War, bearing in mind the facilities available to different subdivisions in the case of Imperial Wars (i.e. set ranges and course that may be conducted under even the most limited conditions). The tallying must be completed

prior to the start of the on site War, with the course being set by the minister of Joust and War with the advice of the Minister of Archery, bearing in mind the facilities available to different subdivisions in the case of Imperial Wars.

In relation to the Imperial Crown War 2002

Pursuant to current law, the archery war point and tournament may be conducted off-site and on different days if facilities are not available at the war site. The site of the Imperial Crown War West 2002 has no such facilities. The archery war point and Imperial tournament for said Imperial Crown War for those sites which cannot provide on-site archery will be conducted as follows: It will be shot at any practice or tournament conducted between August 1 and August 27, 2002. Scores will be collected by the local archery minister or, in absence of the minister, the Crown, or any Knight the Crown designates for this purpose.

The standard 60cm FITA target will be used. If the 60cm is not available you may use an accurate facsimile. All courses to be fired at 20 yards. A score sheet with game name, real name and candidate that is being supported will be forwarded to the Imperial Minister of Archery at baron_blackarrow@hotmail.com (or Imperial Deputy Minister of Archery, West

at macgyver92@earthlink.net), and the Imperial Crown at empress@adrianempire.org not later than August 27 via e-mail. Participants must either pre-register for the war (paying the registration fee), postmarked by August 27, or register at the site by close of registration Saturday, August 31. Ministers may carry registration to the war site if they wish. For your scores to count and to receive any points, you must register. If formatting fails, the scores can not be counted so be alert for correspondence concerning formatting.

The course of fire will be:

- One (1) Masters' Tournament War Point: 6 arrows at 20 yds (possible score 60), combined score of all Masters list (Bowman).
- One (1) Knights' War Point: 6 arrows at 20 yds (possible score 60); combined score of all Knights list (Huntsman)
- One (1) Open Tournament War Point: 6 arrows at 20 yds(possible score 60); combined score of all masters list and knights list. (This is to be fired in addition to the two list mentioned above.)

Supporters will be the score for the Champion's point.

For the separate Imperial Archery tournament: 6 arrows at 20 yds (possible score 60) Bowman's and Huntsman list.

All targets for the Imperial Crown War 2002 & Imperial Archery Tournament 2002 targets will be scored as follows:

- the inner yellow circle 10X
- the middle yellow circle: 10
- the outer yellow circle: 9
- the inner red circle: 8
- the outer red circle: 7
- the inner blue circle: 6
- the outer blue circle: 5
- the inner black circle: 4
- the outer black circle: 3
- the inner white circle: 2
- the outer white circle: 1

Should an unforeseen event arise this writ may be used at the discretion of the Imperial Minister of Archery in conjunction with the Deputy Imperial Minister of Joust and War East for the Imperial Crown War East.



LENTILS

by Dame Maud de Clayton

One of the advantages of attending an event or meeting in another subdivision is having the opportunity to explore other cuisines.

The Archduchy of Caerleon is known throughout the Empire for...lentils! Members of the Imperial Estates that attended the recent Meeting held in Thatuna received gifts of bags of lentils; at the request of several estate holders, some recipes for preparing lentils for events are included below.

Lentil Puree

(from *The Medieval Kitchen: Recipes from France and Italy* by Odile Redon, Françoise Sabban and Silvano Serventi)

This recipe is from a 14th century Tuscan manuscript, and is entitled "*Lenti altramente*."

1 pound lentils

1 *bouquet garni*: a selection of parsley, sage, rosemary, thyme, basil, etc.

3 tablespoons good olive oil

1 pinch saffron (5 or 6 threads)

6 tablespoons freshly grated parmesan cheese

4 eggs, beaten

salt

Wash the lentils carefully and place in a large pot with 4 times their volume of water, the bouquet garni, the olive oil, and the saffron. Simmer over low heat until lentils are tender. Drain lentils if necessary and salt to taste. Mash lentils and press through a food mill or sieve.

Mix the parmesan cheese with the eggs. Reheat the lentils if they have cooled and remove from heat. Add the egg mixture and mix well. The lentils will form a smooth, firm and very flavorful puree.

(Note: This recipe contains uncooked eggs; if you are at all concerned about food-borne illness, you can substitute a pasteurized egg mixture).

Lentils have long been a part of Arab cuisine. Known as "*adas*," they were combined with meats and spices, dressed with yogurt, simmered with sugar, raisins, and spices, and cooked with vegetables such as Swiss chard. Interestingly, with lentils bears the same name: *Adasiya*.

Some of the earliest recipes for using lentils are located in the *Kitab al-Tabikh*, written by Muhammad ibn al-Hasan ibn Muhammad ibn al-Karim al-Katib al-Baghdadi in 1226. Written more than thirty years before the Mongols sacked Baghdad, it is considered to be representative of the "pure" Arabic cooking that provided the Islamic influence in medieval Mediterranean cooking.

Adasiya

(from *Medieval Arab Cookery: Essays and Translations* by Maxime Rodinson, A.J. Arberry, and Charles Perry)

Cut up the meat, and dissolve the tail (fat similar to beef suet) as usual. Put this meat into the oil and fry lightly until browned: then town in a little salt, cumin, and brayed dry coriander, and cover with water. When nearly cooked, add beet washed and cut into pieces four fingers long. When thoroughly boiling, add as required lentils, cleaned and washed, and keep a steady fire going until the lentils are cooked. When set smooth and definitely cooked, add as required fine-bruised garlic, stirring with a ladle. Then leave over a slow fire: and remove. When serving squeeze over it lemon juice.

Adasiyya

(from *Medieval Arab Cookery: Essays and Translations* by Maxime Rodinson, A.J. Arberry, and Charles Perry)

This sweeter recipe for lentils is from a 14th century Arab manuscript entitled *Kitab Wasf al-At'ima al-Mu'tada*, completed on November 30, 1373.

Cook peeled lentils until done in a little water, and add vinegar and sugar, as much as you choose to mix, and thicken it with the two of them, and rub almonds, jujubes, and raisins and throw them onto it and take it up. Throw in all the *atraf al-tib** and ginger, pepper, and saffron.

* A spice mixture of spikenard, betel, laurel leaf, nutmeg, mace, cardamom, cloves, rose hips, common ash, long pepper, ginger. A mixture of cardamom and cloves can be substituted.

Adasiyya

(from *Medieval Arab Cookery: Essays and Translations* by Maxime Rodinson, A.J. Arberry, and Charles Perry)

This recipe is also from the *Kitab Wasf al-At'ima al-Mu'tada*.

Cut meat up. Melt tail and throw its cracklings away. Put the meat in the pot with water to cover. When it boils well and is skimmed, take Swiss chard and cut it the size of a finger and wash it, then throw it in the pot. When it boils a second time, throw salt and spices on it, as much as needed. Then put lukewarm water on it, as much as the quantity of the lentils, and leave it until it boils. Then take as much lentils as needed, pick them over, wash them clean, and put them in the pot. Cover it and kindle the fire continuously under it until it is done. When it is done, return the melted tail fat to it, and take as much garlic as necessary and throw it on it, and it settles and is taken up.


