College of Arms

The following are immediate policy changes to Heraldry submissions (see Heraldry manual for verbage changes):

All Submissions must be Blazoned now,since we are putting them into a database the only way to cut down on time and verify what being entered matches the device we must have both.

LOCAL LEVEL 1. Each presentation, except Electronic submissions given to the Local Geographic Chartered Subdivision Sovereign of Arms turned in with an official Registration form must included the following copies: Current a. Three (3) full-color copies. b. Two (2) line drawing copies. i. A "line drawing" is equivalent to what would appear in a child's coloring book. Nothing is filled in, not even those areas that would appear as black. Internal details, however, are present. ii. Hatchings are not necessary; the outlines are all that are needed. c. Copies of all applicable documentation to accompany each of the full-color copies.

XX. REGISTRATION FORMS D. COLORS
Registration forms must be colored in clear primary colors. Because the inks have shown a tendency to change over time,color photocopies or computergenerated color forms must be blazoned or labeled.

We are still working out verbage on a few other issues,but Her Imperial Majesty approved these for now. If there any questions please contact me directly.


Terre Neuve

Heraldry Status in Adria

To the Populace of the Empire does The Fleur de Lis King of Arms send greetings. The College of Arms has been very busy, fielding many questions about the backlog of Heraldry submissions that currently exist. Much progress has been made; working with Morgan de Cameron of Terre Neuve (The Imperial Webmaster) we will be rolling out a database that will contain all Arms registered in the Empire. We are still trying to get all submissions since the last Letter of Registration, so that they may be entered and final approvals can go out. All local Sovereign of Arms and their respective Crowns have been very cooperative, and are preparing copies to be sent to the College as we speak. Many thanks to our Imperial Crowns for their support. It is the mission of all in the COA to see our Heraldry fly proudly throughout the Empire.

I would like to explain the Heraldry process for those that may not be experienced in how Heraldry works within Adria. The first step is working with your local Sovereign of Arms for guidance on creating a design, either for personal Device, a badge, a local Ministry position or an Estate. You may also download a copy of the Heraldry manual for information on the submission process. <http://www.adrianempire.org/documents/manuals/hrules-01.pdf>

To know when, and how you may display arms once approved you will want to review the manual on Armigerous rights, Regalia & Modes of Address, Orders and Awards, and Ministry Badges. <http://www.adrianempire.org/documents/manuals/regalia-99.pdf>. The College of Arms will also be creating a Frequently Asked Questions list to help clarify these policies.

There are several basic rules that must be followed in designing your arms.



1) The Rules of Tincture (or allowable colors): Color may not be placed on Color, nor Metal on Metal. This Rule is generally inviolable, though there are exceptions. And you may encounter some examples that "slipped through" in the past.

2) The basic Colors are Red/Gules, Green/Vert, Blue/Azure, Black/Sable, & Purple/Purple. The Metals are Silver or White/Argent, & Gold or Yellow/Or.

I suggest start with a color or two, and a metal that you like. Once you have picked those a division of field may be used if you wish. Also called Ordinaries.

Now you are ready to add a Charge, which is an object or creature (or group of similar objects) that form the centerpiece for the design -- three roses, a lion, two spears crossed, and so on

3) If you wish you can download a variety of heraldic clipart and create your device on your computer than copy and paste it onto a submission form and email it to your local SOA.

Other great resources include AC Fox Davies book *The Complete Guide to Heraldry*, *Heraldry; Sources, symbols and Meanings* McGraw-Hill Books, & *Heraldic Crests* by James Fairbairn.

Device or Badge?

My device says "I am HERE". My badge says, "This belongs to me".

Your device goes on your personal stuff that wouldn't be present unless YOU were present: chair, cup, trencher, banner, list-shield, armor.

Your badge goes on your stuff, which may or may not require your presence: trunk, extra chairs, spare dishes, retainers, children.

That's the basic difference.

You wear your subdivision's badge to show allegiance, especially at an inter-group event like War or Imperial Coronation.

Any Adrian may bear the Adrian badge: Argent, a cross or. This is very useful as a way to mark signs going to Adrian events, or to mark an Adrian encampment at a non-Adrian event (such as an SCA war). It's also a way to show Imperial service or allegiance.

Basic Basic Basics

The rules of heraldry are complex - even the heralds have trouble keeping it all straight. That said, between our College of Arms, and the manuals and guidelines available, it's not that difficult to create arms. Here is a recap of the most basic of the rules:

Colors. You cannot put a color on top of a color, or a metal on top of a metal. The only colors you may use are gules (red), vert (green), azure (blue), purpure (purple), and sable (black). The only metals you may use are argent (silver), and or (gold).

Style. We are recreating a period in history. Your heraldry should reflect accurate styles and subjects of the period.

Real life. Forget it. Heraldry is not real life. Real life portraits and pictures are not used. Landscapes are not used. Emblems and logos are not used.

Simplicity. Keep it simple! Complexity is difficult to repeat. And you will want to repeat it everywhere on everything!

Conflict. Your heraldry is unique to you. It can't be too close to the same as that of someone else. And no one else's can be too close to the same as yours.

Registration. The biggest reason for registering your arms is protection. Once registered, it is safeguarded against conflict by anyone else in Adria.

Exceptions. There are exceptions to everything.

Things to remember

- Standards are restricted to 2nd and 3rd level Knights.
- During the height of the Age of Chivalry, knights' flags had a pennoncelle attached to them. When this was cut off, the flag became a banner and the man became a Knight Banneret. This practice is occasionally used in Adria when a Knight Combattant is elevated to 2nd Level.
- Remember that in Adria, you have to be armigerous to display your arms. You can be made armigerous by (a) being made a Lord or Lady, (b) getting Knighted, or (c) having the Right to Bear Arms granted to you by the King.
- The only exception to the above is SHIELDS. Anyone may bear a shield with their arms when they are fighting in the lists.

Devices and Badges

What's the difference?

There are no stylistic differences between Devices and Badges other than that Badges may be "fieldless" or "tinctureless". "Fieldless" means that the badge is a unified whole unto itself (think about the three feathers of the Crown Prince of England), and may be placed on any field you want. "Tinctureless" is reserved to the Imperial Crown and its agents, and is used for things like wax seals, that can have no specified tincture.

So, beyond that, there's no stylistic difference, officially. I would recommend that, if you are considering a badge, that you come up with something that is both simple and a unified whole. A badge should be **simple**, above all else. You're going to replicate this thing a heck of a lot more than your arms, so you'd better be prepared to make something easy.

Some people (like me) preserve their history in their badges. When I changed my persona and my name, I changed my arms as well. I kept my old arms as a badge; they're still **mine**, after all!

What to do with your badge.

The badge-on-the-belt (the "belt favour") is a post-period concept introduced by the SCA - not period.

Badges can be displayed in any shape; the roundel is the most common, but is by no means restricted to that. Even a shield shape is OK. There's no size restriction, either. However, if you are not armigerous in your own right, you may not display any heraldry whatsoever. The only exception to this is your Crown granting you the specific right to do so. This is usually accomplished by the Crown granting you the title of Lord or Lady. If you are the head of an Estate, you are not armigerous in your own right and may only display the arms of your Estate.

If you are armigerous in your own right, but not a Knight, you may not wear your arms on your person in anything larger than 6" on its longest edge. If it's in a shield shape, the shield is no longer than 6". You may not let anyone else wear your badge, but you may place your badge on anything you wish.

If you are a Knight, you may wear a tabard with your arms on it. If you are a 2nd Level Knight, you additionally have the Right of Livery. Now you can go nuts with it, and put your badge on your people as well as your stuff.

What kind of stuff gets heraldic display?

The three feathers badge is found **everywhere** on the PoW's stuff. His estate in Cornwall has embossed medallions with it on every wall section, above every door, on every conceivable surface. If you saw the special on His Royal Highness' organic farming co-op on PBS a few years ago, they showed his estate with all that heraldry everywhere.

Chair. The back of your camp chair is a perfect place. If it's your personal chair that only you sit in, then put your Arms on it. If it's just part of your household stuff for general use by your family and retainers, then put your badge on it.

Cup & plate. Another great place. If it's **your** cup that nobody else would dream of drinking out of, put your arms on it. Same for your plate - wouldn't it look cool to have your arms enameled onto your plate?

Banner. Your arms, of course. This includes your battle shield, as well as your list-tree shield. If your retainers fight as a unit, (and you're a K2) then make them all matching shields with your badge on it.

Livery. Throw them all into matching tabards, with or without your badge, and you've got instant group identification. It's a great way to make new members of your household feel part of the group.

Herald's tabard. If you want to hire a personal herald, then you should have a nifty herald's tabard with your **arms** on it for him to wear. This is also a Livered Right.

Squire's Belt. This is one place where tradition is exceedingly strong. It's the one place where the Knight's arms are permissible outside his person. The very tongue of the belt is a great place to put your arms. When introducing the new squire to the populace, the Knight says, "Treat him as you would treat me". This seems to be the underlying mindset behind this Tradition - when you are talking to someone's squire, it's as if you are talking to **them**. Kind of the same way you deal with a tabarded herald.

Other stuff. Your badge goes on your sewing basket, your first-aid kit, your armor repair kit, your tourney chest, your stuff. Experiment, and do research. The illuminations have many examples of heraldic display for us to look at.
